

The 15th Annual Chesapeake Open June 24 – 27, 2010

Welcome to the Chesapeake Open Competition sponsored by The Baltimore Figure Skating Club and sanctioned and approved by U.S. Figure Skating. The Chesapeake Open Competition is open to all skaters in good standing with U.S. Figure Skating and will be governed by the rules specified by U.S. Figure Skating for the 2010-2011 Competitive Season, except where otherwise stated. Additionally, this year's competition will utilize the International Judging System "IJS" for all Singles & Dance events Juvenile or higher. The "6.0" judging system will be utilized for all other events.

RINK: The competition will be held at The Gardens Ice House. The IJS competition will be held on an ice surface that measures 100' x 200' with rounded corners, and an additional surface measuring 85' x 200' will also be used.

DIRECTIONS: Traveling I-95 take exit 33B (Rt. 198 west), at the 2nd light (Old Gunpowder Road) make a left. Travel approximately 1.5 miles and The Gardens Ice House is on the right. DEADLINE: **Entries must be postmarked no later than midnight May 14, 2010.**

RULES: The 2010 Chesapeake Open will be conducted according to the 2010 US Figure Skating rulebook, and **incorporating changes for the 2010-2011 competition season** adopted by the Governing Council in May 2010. All skaters in events using IJS are required to submit a planned program content form with their entry. For program content form see the Baltimore Figure Skating Club website (www.baltimorefigureskatingclub.com).

ELIGIBILITY: All entrants must be eligible members in good standing of clubs having membership in the USFSA or be Individual members of the USFSA or Basic Skill Program.

Singles and Dance events: Skaters may enter any event for which they qualify OR one level higher, but **not** both levels in the same event. A skater deciding to skate up a level in any event is not required to skate up a level in all events.

Solo Dance: Skaters may enter any event for which they qualify AND ALSO one level higher.

EXHIBITIONS: There will be no planned exhibitions. If there are only two skaters entered in an event when the competition schedule is published, the event will be cancelled at the discretion of the Chief Referee. If withdrawals subsequent to the posting of the schedule reduce the number of entries in an event to one, the remaining skater will be contacted as soon as possible and offered the option of either skating an exhibition or receiving a refund of the entry fee for that event.

PRACTICE ICE: Practice Ice sign up sheets will be posted on the Baltimore Figure Skating Club website (www.baltimorefigureskatingclub.com) approximately three weeks before the competition.

SCHEDULE: **Do not send self-addressed, stamped envelopes.** A tentative schedule will be available approximately three weeks before the competition. **Individual group assignments with dates and times and a tentative schedule of events will be posted on the Baltimore Figure Skating Club's website (www.baltimorefigureskatingclub.com) approximately two weeks after the close of entries. PLEASE CHECK FOR SCHEDULE CHANGES PRIOR TO TRAVELING TO THE COMPETITION.**

ENTRY FEES: **Singles and Solo Dance events:** First IJS Event - \$115; each additional IJS event \$85.
First non-IJS Event \$90.00; each additional event \$65.00;

Couples Dance Events: First IJS Event - \$115 per team.
First non-IJS Event - \$90 per team.

If a skater is skating both an IJS and a regular event, the first event is IJS event (\$115), the second event is a regular additional event (\$65).

In the event that a skater is entering two events such as a Team event and a solo event, the skater is to pay the first event fee for both events.

NO REFUNDS: After May 14, 2010, no refunds will be granted except for events cancelled by the Referee. (See Rule 3235)

LATE ENTRIES: At the discretion of the Committee late entries may be accepted, subject to a \$50.00 fee.

RETURNED CHECKS: There will be a \$50 fee charged for every returned check.

EVENT CHANGE Please review your application closely with your coach to ensure you have entered the correct events and levels. After a tentative schedule is posted, any change in registration because of an error on your application will result in a \$25.00 fee per change at the discretion of the committee.

REGISTRATION: A registration desk will open approximately one-hour before the first event of each day. All other competitors should register one hour before their event and turn in their music at that time.

ADMISSION: No admission fee will be charged for spectators.

MUSIC: CD's will only be accepted. Each CD must be CLEARLY labeled with the competitor's name, event. Each CD must contain only one program. Competitors must have a duplicate CD with them at the competition. The Baltimore Figure Skating Club assumes NO responsibility for unclaimed music by the end of the competition.

Due to compatibility and reliability reasons no music may be submitted on re-recordable "CD-RW" discs. CDs will not be returned by mail. The Baltimore Figure Skating Club assumes no responsibility or liability due to the damage, loss, or deficient quality of music media.

AWARDS: Medals will be awarded to all first, second, third and fourth place finishers in each event.

The Chesapeake Open Trophy will be awarded for the Intermediate Short Program, the Allan Trophy will be awarded for the Novice Long Program, and the President's Cup Trophy will be awarded for the Intermediate Free Dance.

Failed elements may not be re-tried. Additional jumps or spins are not permitted and will result in a deduction. No Test, Pre-Preliminary, Pre-Juvenile, and Adult levels will be skated on half ice. Juvenile will use the full ice surface. Male skaters may be combined with female skaters for this event.
